

# *Creekside Homeowners Tennis Rules – 06/17/2009*

## **The Tennis Committee**

The Tennis Chairperson is appointed by the Board to regulate the use of the tennis facility and make recommendations regarding its use to the Board.

## **General Court Rules:**

- No bicycles, skateboards, roller blades, scooters, or any other non-tennis activities are permitted on the tennis courts.
- Pets are not allowed in the tennis viewing area or on the courts.
- All beverages that are taken on the courts must be non-breakable containers. Glass containers are not permitted.
- Please clean up after play. The team captain is responsible for clean up of the court area after matches and practices. Repeat offenders will be subject to loss of practice time.
- All chairs, rollers, tables and trashcans must be returned to their designated area.
- Damage is the responsibility of homeowners involved and must be reported following play to a member of the tennis committee or HOA Management Company.
- Please be sure to lock the pool area and pick up restrooms after league matches.
- Junior players (15 and under) must yield to adults after 4:30 p.m. on weekdays and at all times on weekends and on holidays unless accompanied by an adult player.
- However, if juniors have started play in an unreserved court, they will be allowed to continue playing until the end of the half-hour time period. During School months, juniors will have the same court reservation privileges as adults.
- Proper tennis attire is required at all times. Shirts are required.

## **Leagues:**

1. Organized teams, leagues, social events and regularly scheduled clinics must be pre-approved by the tennis committee and/or HOA Board to insure no conflicts arise. League request forms are available in the management office.
2. All team captains must turn in rosters and nonresident fees to the management office at the start of each playing season. Non-residents will be required to pay a \$25.00 fee per league season.
3. Creekside tennis teams must consist of at least 75% Creekside residents while striving for 100% resident membership. The Team Captain must be a Creekside resident. Qualified residents must be chosen preferentially as team members over nonresidents.
4. . Organized tennis events such as socials and tournaments must be advertised to the tennis community at large so that all qualified players have the opportunity to participate.
5. League Captains are responsible for the area around the tennis court during and after a match or practice session. If the area requires cleaning or maintenance the League could be charged a fee for repairs or clean-up.
6. Leagues are allowed to utilize 2 courts. Residences that are not part of the leagues should have the other 2 courts available for play during league matches or league practice.
